Students residing in St. Francis also have the option to attend private schools, participating charter schools, virtual schools, another public school through full-time Open Enrollment or Course Options, attend classes from institutes of higher education through Dual Enrollment (Youth / Course Options), or participate in a home-based private educational program.

Additionally, the St. Francis School District participates in the Special Needs Voucher Program. Under this program, a child with a disability who meets the program's specific eligibility requirements may apply to attend an eligible, participating private school under a scholarship awarded through the State's "Special Needs Scholarship Program," as established under Section 115.7915 of Wisconsin State Statutes. The St. Francis School District employs highly qualified special education staff including teachers, paraprofessionals, and related service providers such as occupational therapists. Staff is trained to support all disability-related needs and are skilled at creating dynamic programming that assists students in realizing their full potential. Students receive individualized specialized instruction that helps them progress toward grade level standards in a nurturing environment.
